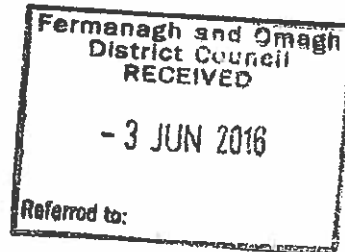

Abandonment – Crockanboy Road, Greencastle, County Tyrone

The Department for Infrastructure gives notice of its proposal to abandon an area of 6170 square metres of road at Crockanboy Road, Greencastle, Co. Tyrone, from a point 300 metres north-west of its junction with Mullydoo Road extending for a distance of 1118.5 metres in a westerly direction, after completion of such works providing alternative facilities for road traffic as the Department considers necessary. The area of road proposed to be abandoned is delineated on a map which, together with a copy of a draft order, may be inspected free of charge during office hours within the period 15th June 2016 to 25th July 2016 at the Department's TransportNI Western Division, County Hall, Drumragh Avenue, Omagh, BT79 7AF or by viewing online at www.infrastructure-ni.gov.uk/consultations.

Any person may, within the period above, object to the proposal by writing to the Department at the address above or by emailing transportni.western@infrastructure-ni.gov.uk stating the grounds of the objection. The Department for Infrastructure(a) makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 68(1) of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993(b) and now vested in it(c).

The Department in accordance with Article 68(4) of that Order proposes on the completion of works providing alternative facilities for road traffic to abandon the area of road described in the Schedule.

Notice has been published, served and displayed in compliance with paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 8 to that Order.

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as The Crockanboy Road, Greencastle, County Tyrone (Abandonment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2016 and shall come into operation on 2016.

(2) In this Order “the Contractor” means Dalradian Gold Ltd. whose registered office is situated at Killybrack Business Park, 3 Killybrack Road, Omagh, Co. Tyrone, BT79 7DG.

2. The Contractor shall carry out such works as the Department considers necessary and on completion of the works the area of road described in the Schedule shall be abandoned.

AREA OF ROAD TO BE ABANDONED

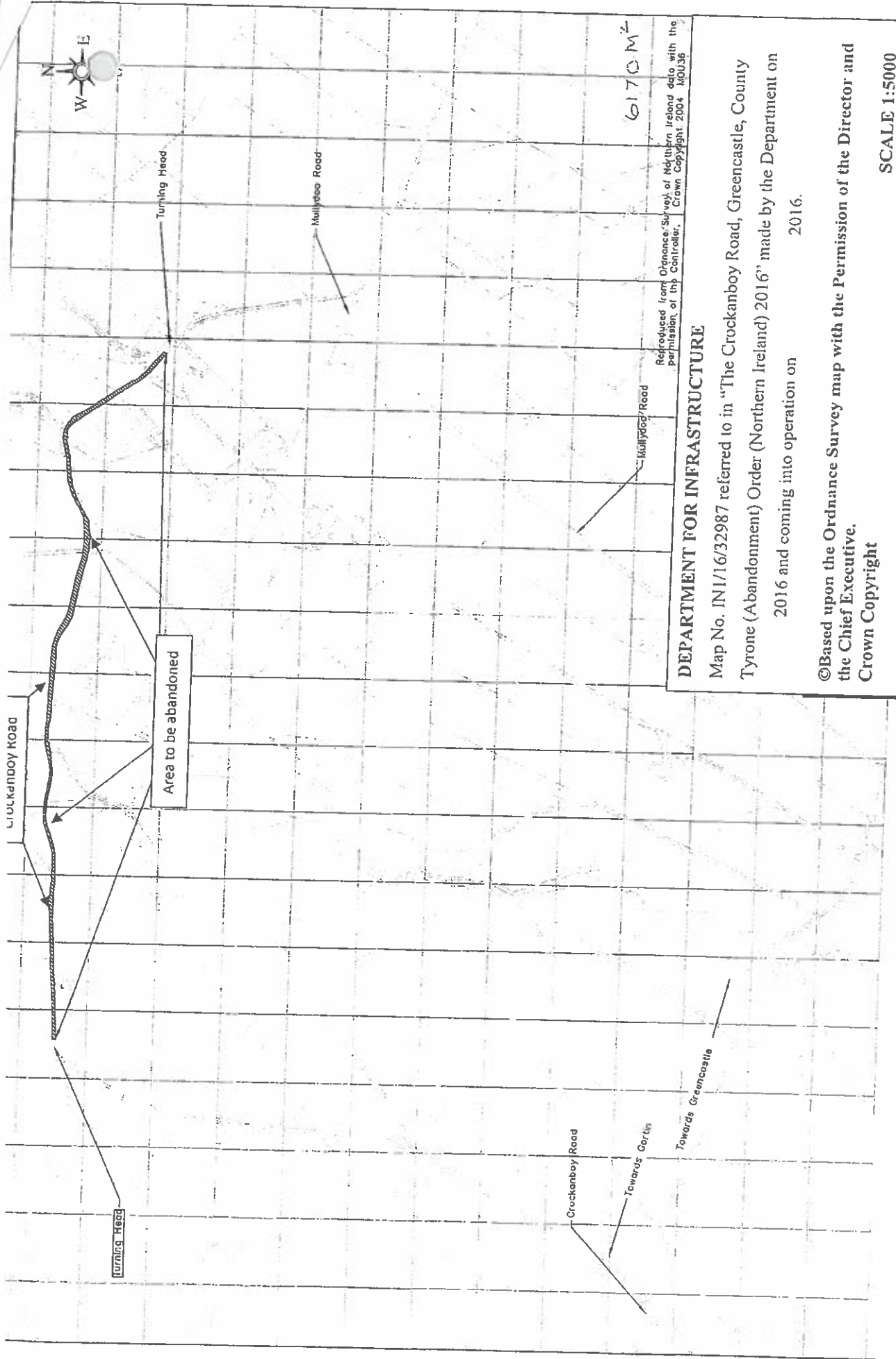

RE: Proposed Abandonment at Mullydoo Road Greencastle

I write on behalf of Fermanagh and Omagh District Council in response to your letter dated 24 February 2016 regarding the above. I rang your office today but understand that you are on leave.

The Council wrote to confirm its objection to the abandonment on 9 March 2016 but does not appear to have received a response to this letter. Further the Council has been contacted by [REDACTED] Department of Infrastructure, in a letter dated 2 June 2016 (copy enclosed for your information) which appears to be the same abandonment as referenced in your letter although the road name has been changed.

I wish to confirm that the Council's position is that it still wishes to oppose this abandonment. Further the Council has statutory duties towards public rights of way as defined under Article 3 of the Access to the Countryside (NI) Order 1983 and has been requested to assert this route as Public Right Of Way. The investigation process has begun and the Council would ask that the Department does not abandon this stretch of road given that the process is in train.

Could you please advise as to the Departments position regarding abandonment given the Council's objection? An urgent response is requested please.
