INTEGRATED POLLUTION PREVENTION AND CONTROL

This notice replaces a previous notice which was published on 24 March 2016 and provides clarification on the location of the proposed installation.

Notice is hereby given that Mr Gareth Mutch has applied to the Chief Inspector for an Integrated Pollution Prevention and Control (IPPC) Permit (Application No. P0528/15A) to operate an installation involving the intensive rearing of poultry. The installation is located 175 metres west of 16 Carrigullin Road, Strabane, Co Tyrone BT82 8MZ (Grid Reference 235528/395589).

The application contains all particulars as required by the Regulations including a description of foreseeable significant effects of emissions from the installation on the environment.

A copy of the application which contains the information listed in Schedule 4 Part 1 (1) of the regulations is available for public inspection, free of charge, between the hours of 09.30 – 12.00 and 14.00 – 15.30 at Northern Ireland Environment Agency, Klondyke Building, Cromac Avenue, Gasworks Business Park, Lower Ormeau Road, Belfast, BT7 2JA and Derry City and Strabane District Council, 47 Derry Road, Strabane, Co Tyrone BT82 8DY. In addition, members of the public who wish to obtain a copy of the relevant information contained in the register can do so upon the payment of a reasonable charge to cover the cost of photocopying.

Written representations about the application may be sent to the Chief Inspector of the Industrial Pollution & Radiochemical Inspectorate, Northern Ireland Environment Agency, (address as above), within 42 days from the date of this publication. All representations will be placed on the public register unless a representation contains a written request to the contrary. ABANDONMENT

CROCKANBOY ROAD, GREENCASTLE, COUNTY TYRONE

The Department for Infrastructure gives notice of its proposal to abandon an area of 6170 square metres of road at Crockanboy Road, Greencastle, Co. Tyrone, from a point 300 metres north-west of its junction with Mullydoo Road extending for a distance of 1118.5 metres in a westerly direction, after completion of such works providing alternative facilities for road traffic as the Department considers necessary. The area of road proposed to be abandoned is delineated on a map which, together with a copy of a draft order, may be inspected free of charge during office hours within the period 15th June 2016 to 25th July 2016 at the Department's TransportNI Western Division, County Hall, Drumragh Avenue, Omagh, BT79 7AF or by viewing online at www.infrastructure-ni.gov.uk/consultations.
