In Northern Ireland forest cover currently sits at just 9 percent, behind the UK average of 13 percent and only 200ha of woodland is planted per year instead of the 900ha recommended recently by the Committee on Climate Change.

The tree planting scheme also helps support the wider STEM curriculum and falls within pupils' 'World Around Us' and biology lessons. The scheme assists teachers and children explore issues around climate change and the need to plant more trees to help remove carbon dioxide from the atmosphere. As the new trees grow they will absorb carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, storing it within the tree and in the soil.

Carbon Neutral Plus status means that in addition to reducing its emissions and supporting an internationally recognised offsetting project,

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## MP welcome additional **'Bedroom** Tax' mitigation plans

WEST Tyrone MP Órfhlaith Begley has welcomed the announcement of plans, by her party colleague and Communities Minister Deirdre Hargey, to make mitigations against the so-called Bedroom Tax permanent as well her plans to introduce further protections.

Heralding the move the Sinn Féin representative said: "The bedroom tax is an unfair and unjust Tory policy designed to punish the poorest and most vulnerable in society

"Sinn Féin fought hard for and secured a mitigation package to offset its introduction here in 2017 and approximately 38,000 householders across the north have been protected against the Tory Bedroom Tax policy in the form of supplementary payments including approximately 1,600 households here in West

"The mitigations previously been due to end in March of 2020, before being extended.

"Minister Hargey is submitting plans to the Executive to make these mitigations, specific only to the north, permanent.

"She is also moving to introduce further legislation to close the loophole which has prevented someone moving to a new property from receiving the top-up payment mitigation." Closing the loophole on the benefit cap is another key protection being added.

Since taking on the Department of Communities portfolio, the Minister has further shown her and our party's commitment to protect the most vulnerable within or community against the damaging impacts of Tory Welfare through a wide range of initiatives and these additional plans further re-enforce this commitment."
