Where levels of any of the substances listed in i-x above, for which no specific limits are set in condition 1 of this consent, are detected in a concentration that would breach the Environmental Quality Standard (EQS) in the receiving water, then Action Plans to reduce the substances(s) in question in the discharge must be developed and agreed with the Department (NIEA).

As discussed with you earlier and again I will discuss removing this paragraph with Richard when he returns to the office.

In addition, the EQS listed in the Informative shall not be exceeded in the Owenkillev River arising from the project discharge.

The informative relates to The Water Framework Directive (Priority Substances and Classification) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2011.

Thanks for your e-mail below and confirmation of acceptance of our proposed revisions. We also requested that dissolved copper be removed from the Informative on the basis that natural background dissolved Cu levels exceed the EQS value, but we note that this has been retained in the Informative.

Dalradian Gold Ltd. (DGL) request a meeting with WMU in your Lisburn offices on Wednesday 8th January at 11.00 to discuss the issue of the dissolved Copper EQS. As you are fully aware the natural background dissolved Cu levels in the Owenkilwe River exceed the EQS limit value of 1ug/litre. Therefore, DGL will not be able to comply with this proposed condition in the draft consent, and such a condition is clearly unreasonable.

This is a critical issue affecting the DGL Curraghinalt Gold Project, and hence the reason for requesting an urgent meeting with you and your colleagues as soon as possible.

Please confirm that 11.00 on the 8th January suits for the meeting, or if not, please suggest an alternative time on the 8th for the meeting.
